Climate & Nature Action Survey

Our Northamptonshire Climate & Nature Action Survey closed on Monday, and I am pleased to report that we received 180 responses from the 220 councils that we sent it to, which is **an 82% response rate**. Thank you very much indeed to all those that took the time to complete it; it makes me very proud that we can achieve that sort of response, and that parish and town councils are willing to take the time to contribute. It provides us with a very robust and valuable data set, with the only downside being that due to the phenomenal response we now have a lot of data to crunch! We have started already, and we are using Artificial Intelligence (AI) to do the heavy lifting for us. There will be a headline report in the March/April *eUpdate* (due out on 28 March 2025) and then a fuller report in due course. The data will help us identify the most common actions that parish and town councils get involved in so that we can disseminate best practice across the county, and the things that councils don't currently do but wanted more information on. Weekend Reflections

There is no excuse whatsoever for women being treated any differently to men in the parish and town council sector. For clerks and other officers there should be equal opportunity and equal pay, and for councillors there should be equal representation and equal participation. This Saturday is **International Women's Day** (https://www.internationalwomensday.com), which provides an opportunity to think about how all organisations, including parish and town councils, can ensure gender equality. Councils may want to use it as a trigger to look at things like maternity, paternity, and parental leave policies, which can create a significant barrier for women, who often bear a disproportionate share of childcare responsibilities. Remember that the Code of Conduct sets standards against sexism and misogyny and requires all councillors to "treat others with respect... and challenge poor behaviour wherever it occurs".

On Sunday, it is the national **COVID-19 Day of Reflection** to mark the fifth anniversary of the pandemic. The day will be an opportunity for the public to remember and commemorate those who lost their lives during the pandemic, reflect on the sacrifices made and the impact on our daily lives, and pay tribute to the work of health and social care staff, frontline workers, researchers, and all those who volunteered and showed acts of kindness during this unprecedented time.
