THE REVEREND WRITES

Once again, we come to November - traditionally the month of remembering. Memories and remembering are central to us and in many ways make up part of who we are.

At the beginning of the month, we celebrate All Saints and All Souls which give us a chance to remember with thankfulness all those who we love but see no longer. We move swiftly onto 'Remember, remember, the fifth of November' with its reminder of the gunpowder plot. Then, of course, we have our national act of Remembrance on Remembrance Sunday which this year falls on the 10th. There will be Acts of Remembrance in churches and at war memorials across the benefice as we remember those who died fighting to protect us and bring peace and justice to our world, and we pray for those serving in our Armed Forces today. Both bonfire night and Remembrance Sunday can serve to remind us of the importance of not dismissing or burying history, but rather learning from it.

For Christians, of course, the most significant act of remembering is when we come together to remember in bread and wine the death and resurrection of Jesus, obeying his command to "Do this in remembrance of me." (Luke 22:19). Jesus' willing sacrifice of himself on the cross for the sake of others is, for Christian believers, the ultimate expression of the self-giving love at the heart of God, when Christ's hands were marked by the nails of the cross.

So, in this season of Remembrance, as we remember with candles, fireworks, poppies, or bread and wine, may we all take time to pause, reflect, and be thankful.

- Fruit and veg
- Take <u>hardwood cuttings</u> from healthy fruit bushes, including <u>currants</u>, <u>blueberries</u> and <u>gooseberries</u>
- Use <u>cloches</u> to protect winter <u>peas</u>, beans and <u>salads</u>, but leave the ends open as good ventilation is vita
- Prune autumn-fruiting raspberries to the ground after harvesting
- Plant <u>garlic</u>, <u>shallots</u> and <u>onions</u> in free-draining soil or raised beds, then cover with <u>fleece</u>
- Support top-heavy <u>Brussels sprouts</u> with sturdy canes, and pile earth up around the stems for extra stability Happy Gardening - Diane, Teresa & Viv

LITCHBOROUGH PAROCHIAL CHARITY - ANNUAL GRANTS Charity number 201062

The Litchborough Parochial Charity has provided financial support and assistance to people in Litchborough Parish for over 150 years. To those in need it offers: 1. Heating grants to those of state pension age; 2. Small grants to pensioner widows/widowers/those living alone; 3. Grants to students and apprentices to aid their studies. 4. Other ad hoc grants to support one-off circumstances of ill health/financial distress.

Heating grants

These are granted to retired persons living in the parish who are in need of assistance with heating costs. Direct payments to energy suppliers are made, normally in December each year. Existing beneficiaries do not need to reapply.

Education and training grants

Are you 16 yrs+, at college or university, or on an apprenticeship or vocational training course? The charity is likely to be able to award a grant towards the cost of items you have to buy, such as equipment or books. You may apply each year until you have completed your studies. Other ad hoc requests for assistance

If neither of the above circumstances apply but you are experiencing financial hardship through ill health or other difficulty, the charity may be able to help with grants towards costs, for example transport to and from hospital.


