

Have you ever thought that you would like to know more about the Bible? Have you ever wondered how the Old and New Testaments fit together to tell the whole story of God's plan for salvation? Did Jesus ever exist and is he really the Son of God? Even those of us who have been going to church and reading the Bible for years have questions we would like to ask and the opportunity for discussion. The Bible contains over three-quarters of a million words so there is always plenty to learn!

This autumn we are offering the chance for anyone in the villages who is interested to delve into the Bible. It doesn't matter if you have never opened a copy or know something and would like to find out more. You don't have to attend church to come, there will be no expectations of a deep Theological understanding and no obligation to even say anything if you prefer just to listen! Litchborough Gardening Club - As the busy summer fades into Autum, the gardening club have enjoyed trips to Canons Ashby, Kathy Browns Garden, Hampton Court

Flower Show and Buscot Park and a very successful open gardens !! But now with a new season approaching, we will be back in the village hall on the first Wednesday of the month at 7.30pm from  $4^{th}$  Sept September - "Semi ripe cuttings in an Autumn garden" by Helen Mandel. This is open to members and non members ( charge for non members £5 a session).

#### Plants-and-flowers jobs for September - Buy spring bulbs

Most bulbs are ready to plant straight away, with the exception of tulips, which are best left until November to avoid the disease tulip fire. Whether you're buying online, or garden centre or supermarket, look for named varieties and buy the biggest size bulbs you can for the best display of flowers. Plant the bulbs at three times the height of the bulb

Divide perennials -Autumn is a good time to divide clumps of perennials such as <u>hardy geraniums</u>. Lift the clump and divide into pieces, either by prising it apart with two forks or cutting it up with a spade or bread knife. Each piece needs some leaves and roots. Older pieces from the centre of the clump should be thrown away, but newer pieces can be replanted or shared with friends. Some perennials, such as sedums, will benefit from being divided every few years to keep the clump growing vigorously.

Sow winter salads Early September is the best time to sow salad plants for harvests between November and early May. Grow them out of the worst of the weather under a protective covering, such as glass, polythene, <u>fleece</u> or insect-proof mesh. Although no extra heat is needed, without any protective covering harvests are small in winter and of lower quality. Sow in modular trays using a <u>Best Buy compost for sowing seeds</u> and then plant outside when they're big enough to handle next month.

Winter salads to try: Chervil - sow asap for small harvests of fine flavour. Chicories and endives- small harvests of bitter and pretty leaves. Claytonia - very hardy, and prolific in mild winters. Corn salad - for harvests from November to April. Land cress - sow asap for small harvests of strong flavours, and beware pigeons. Lettuce, - to stand as small plants then heart up in spring or for regular picking of outer leaves from November to May. Mizuna - for plentiful leaves in autumn and occasional winter harvests. Mustards - large leaves in mild weather. Salad rocket - crops in small amounts through the winter. Spinach 'Medania' - sow asap for small, steady and sweet harvests
